## Opinion

Also, One Foreign subsidiary company, whose financial statements reflect total assets of Rs. 2,208.64 lakhs as at 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2021, total revenue is NIL and net cash outflow of Rs. 3.35 lakhs for the year ended on that date, as considered in the consolidated financial statements. This financial statement is unaudited and has been furnished to us by the management and our opinion on this consolidated financial statement, in as far as it related to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of this subsidiary, our report in terms of sub sections (3) and (11) of section 143 of the act in so far as it relates to the aforesaid subsidiaries, is based solely on such unaudited financial statement.

Our opinion on the consolidated financial statements, and our report on Other Legal and regulatory requirements below, is not modified in respect of the above and the financial statements certified by the management.
